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2019 ALS Protocol Rollout

The 2019 New York State Collaborative document becomes effective January 1, 2020 but can be implemented sooner.

The Hudson Valley REMAC in conjunction with the Hudson Valley Protocol Committee are offering 2 options to complete the 2019 rollout of the collaborative ALS protocols. All ALS providers are required to complete one of these options by December 31, 2019. Any provider not completing the rollout material and/or not submitting the proper paperwork to their Primary Agency prior to December 31, 2019 will not be able to practice as an ALS provider in the Hudson Valley.

Option 1: The ALS provider may choose to take the Rollout on the LMS (Learning Management System) link using logon information from the BLS Rollout: https://collabornation.net/lms/see_sco_contents/4877172. This link will require the provider to pay an \$8.00 service fee previous to viewing the rollout material. This system will create a certificate upon successful completion of the rollout materials and test. The certificate must be submitted to all agencies you work for as proof of completion. If a copy of the certificate is forwarded to the Hudson Valley Regional office; the provider will be granted **2 MCCH** contact hours by the HVREMAC.

Option 2: The ALS provider can choose to complete the 2019 Rollout of the Collaborative Protocols by means of a Self-Study method. Each provider will be required to review the [Comparison Document](#), which reviews the list of changes in the Collaborative Protocols against the updated protocols. Additionally, a [Collaborative Protocol PowerPoint](#) is available, and should be reviewed as well. Upon the completion of this process the provide must sign and return the attached affidavit that they have reviewed the changes in the protocols, they understand these changes and will comply with these protocols on December 31, 2019 or sooner if their agency meets the Regional requirements to initiate the protocols earlier. Since there is no Physician involvement there will be **NO MCCH** issued for this method.
